Building Bridges to Steward a Transborder Biome.

Protecting the planet entails not only addressing climate change but also creating conditions favorable for human life with minimal impact on our habitat, particularly in the most sensitive biomes and ecosystems. A key milestone in this area was the publishing of the report titled “Análisis y recomendaciones para un abordaje transfronterizo y trinacional del Gran Chaco Americano” (Analysis and Recommendations for a Transborder and Trinational Approach to the South American Chaco). The report was compiled in partnership with Redes Chaco, a regional, multi-stakeholder network, under the umbrella of a UN initiative involving Argentina, Bolivia, and Paraguay.

This report is relevant for the UN and Redes Chaco as well as government officials, business leaders, and civil society organizations. The report contains information and recommendations to facilitate

regional coordination strategies that are adapted to the local context,

ensuring maximum impact both on the Chaco biome as well as the population of approximately 9 million people that live within it.
