In collaboration with FORGE members, the secretariat sets FORGE's strategic direction and identifies organizational objectives. It develops programming to meet these objectives in the learning, alignment and engagement work streams. The secretariat also provides support to FORGE's collective grantmaking process. The secretariat ensures that the organization has governance structures and processes in place that both meet its needs and are appropriate to its stage of development. The secretariat plays a critical coordination role, facilitating the optimal operation of FORGE working spaces, including governance and working bodies. During the project period, the secretariat will deepen and expand the FORGE learning agenda. An important component of this agenda concerns the learning associated with collaborative grantmaking. FORGE will also facilitate processes for members to identify emerging issues and trends, share information and develop analysis, with priority placed on information and perspectives from the field. These insights will inform priority setting and programmatic development, including grantmaking. These learning objectives will be furthered through a combination of activities that include hosting webinars and other events with external subject experts, grantees, funders and other partners; developing materials to share information and analysis; and facilitating internal deliberative processes to critically explore our impact and priorities; among others. The Secretariat will also facilitate aligned funding by FORGE members. The learning processes described above will permit the identification of strategic opportunities and critical capacity gaps in the field, with the objective of facilitating better alignment among FORGE funders' respective grantmaking streams.
